Summer Begins: 12th Annual GM River Days



The 12th Annual GM River Days, will take place along the Detroit River, running Friday, June 22 through Sunday, June 24.

Admission to GM River Days will support the non-profit Detroit Riverfront Conservancy and is free to enter on Friday, between 11 a.m.-5 p.m., \$5 after 5 p.m. on all days and \$3 before 3 p.m. on Saturday & Sunday.

Headlining national music acts include Kool & the Gang along with tribute band *Beatlemania* on Friday evening; *Morris Day and The Time* on Saturday, along with smooth R & B singer *Donnell Jones*; and Canadian R & B singer Tamia performs on Sunday. Tickets are \$35 and include admission to the festival.

There will be a full line-up across four different stages. The *Flagstar Bank Kids Zone* returns with story time, magic shows, strolling *River Walk Buskers*, as well as activities with the DIA, Michigan Science Center and more.

Rivard Plaza will also be the site of a 50-ton sand sculpture. Motorcyclists are invited to ride on down to the riverfront. Free parking will be provided on Atwater Street between St. Antoine and Rivard starting at 6 p.m. on Bike Night, Friday, June 22.

The Metro PCS Zip Line returns, offering a 300-foot long zip line ride for two people straight through the festival. Tickets are \$15 for one ride or two for \$25.

The Michigan Dept. of Natural Resources (DNR) will provide a rock climbing wall for children and adults during the weekend. The celebrated Tuskegee Airmen National Historical Museum will present aerial and educational performances each day. Festival-goers can expect lots of gravity-defying maneuvers with pilots flying upside down and sideways, an airplane flown by the Tuskegee Airmen in World War II and a demonstration of precision formation flying by the museum's own four-aircraft demo team. The airshow will feature emcees at all festival stages. This is one of the very few airshows in all of North America that features mostly local performers.

Festival-goers can also take to the water with Diamond Jack River Tours. Typhoon Tommy, a festival favorite and his world-class jet-ski team will use a variety of freestyle jet-skis and hydroflight devices to perform big air jumps, backflips, corkscrew spins and underwater dives for the crowd.

The United States Coast Guard Auxiliary will add to the fun with rescue

demonstrations and the opportunity to tour a Coast Guard Cutter. The festival hours are 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. each day with activities and events happening from the Detroit/Wayne County Port Authority Terminal and Dock, just west of the GM Renaissance Center, to Rivard Plaza and the William G. Greenfield Village gears up for a celebration of automobile splendor during its annual Motor Muster, over Father's Day weekend, Saturday, June 16 and Sunday, June 17.


This year's Muster focuses on the 1930's through the 1970's, showcasing an unparalleled collection of historic vehicles — from the lean depression-era of the 1930's, the American Homefront during WWII, the futuristic 1950's and revolutionary 1960's, to the bicentennial year of 1976. The weekend will also celebrate the motors that positioned Detroit's Big Three automakers as the best in the world —

MOBIG Brings Bands Back to Belle Isle

An exciting new name has emerged on the summer concert series scene in Greater Detroit, MOBIG -Music On Belle Isle Group.

MOBIG will present River Blast! 2018, a summer music series featuring the area's finest concert bands on Sunday afternoons at Belle Isle State Park. The first concert will be this Sunday, June 17, beginning at 2 p.m. Look for signs directing you to the location on Belle Isle.

Greater Detroit is home to many passionate and talented non-professional musicians who play in concert bands. A few of those musicians formed the group MOBIG, dedicated to returning summer band concerts to Belle Isle and to exploring the restoration/reconstruction of the Remick Band Shell.

Now, MOBIG is working in cooperation with state and local agencies that manage Belle Isle to present the first summer music series in 38 years — *River Blast!* The concerts were originally held at the Remick Band Shell; erected in 1950 by Detroit music publisher Jerome H. Remick, the Remick Band Shell was a popular venue for summer concerts on Belle Isle performed by the Detroit Concert Band until 1980. The Remick Band Shell cost \$150,000 and replaced an older rounded one nestled on a small waterway between the Nancy Brown Carillon Tower and the skating pavilion.

Listeners would sit on the rows of green park benches, lie on blankets on the lawn, or sit in their canoes pulled up on the shore. The stage was 40 x 80 feet and could accommodate 80 musicians. The shell design could push the music of a typical concert out to an audience of 10,000.

"After seeing the Belle Isle Band Shell in such bad shape, a group of us music lovers decided that maybe we need to get bands back on Belle Isle. Years ago there were regular concerts on Belle Isle. In the 1980's the young people with their loud radios drowned out the bands and the bands stopped playing on Belle Isle," comments Cheryl Huff, Vice President, of MOBIG.

Huff continues, "We have 14 bands coming for free. The concerts are also free. We hope it will become a family tradition again. Our goal is to raise enough money to rebuild the Band Shell."

Ruth's Music Notes

This is the time of year when music is bursting out from every corner in my life. The problem is to cover it all. Space precludes more detail.

This past week started with me on Tuesday with the opening of Motown the Musical at the Fisher Theatre. It summarized the music and dancing that came out of Detroit. Certainly, something to be proud of.

The Fisher Theatre will be featuring Hamilton next year through their series Broadwav in Detroit. That should be amazing as well. For tickets call (800) 982-2787.

On Wednesday evening Tuesday Musicale provided a precious glimpse into the musicianship of 15 year-old violinist Miray Ito.

Ito was introduced to us before when we heard pianist Naomi Yamaguchi. There is a good chance that these two will shine together in the future firmament of music.

On the first half of the program Ito performed relatively known glistening pieces together with accompanist Mi-Eun Kim (U of M).

In the second part she performed as soloist In Spohr's Violin Concerto No. 8 with the Tuesday Musicale Chamber Orchestra, conductor Scott Hanoian.

I attended the orchestral version of Turandot on Friday evening - a production which amazed me with the quality music of the orchestra, choir, and soloists.

The conductor, Jader Bignamini, is Resident Conductor of the Orchestra Sinfonica la Verdi, who has worked extensively in opera and particularly with Anna Netrebko. The choir was made up of soloists who appear around Detroit, showing great flexibility in musicianship.

There is a lot more to come, but we can provide here only a short glimpse.

This is the 25th year anniversary of the GLCMF. Through the years, we have changed together with the music that has been performed.

New, living composers were introduced to us as we listened to premiere performances of their works. This season will feature 15 new works, including 10 Birthday Candles to celebrate the anniversary.

There will be four premiere performances at the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History and a new composition by the Stone Composer Fellow Shen Yiwen. See greatlakeschambermusic.org for more details for those events.

On Friday evening, Kerrytown Concert House in Arbor will start its mini-series associated with the festival.







Girl Power 'Steals' the Show

Ocean's 8 is the latest Hollywood gender-swap movie and is the take-off from the *Ocean's Eleven* remakes of the original *Rat Pack* party-heist movies from the 1960's.

It features a focused Debbie Ocean (Sandra Bullock) who was just released from prison after a five year sentence. Before we see her set off her well planned caper she casually scams some fine Bergdorf clothes and a luxury hotel room. Very smooth and unrepentant.

She becomes the leader of an all-female crew targeting a redcarpet affair rather than the usual casino. She only wants females in her crew because, "A *him* gets noticed a *her* gets ignored."

Their target is a five pound Cartier Toussaint diamond necklace worth \$150 million. Her long-time friend Lou (Cate Blanchett), her second-in-command, appears to be doing her David Bowie impression here. Together they recruit six other females for the crew.

Some of the others: Nine Ball is played by Rihanna, the scruffy hacker; Helena Bonham Carter is Rose, the over-the-hill designer; Sarah Paulson is Tammy, the fence; Mindy Kaling is Amita the unhappy jeweler; and Awkwafina plays Constance the cute pickpocket.

The plan is to use a very spoiled hostess of a Met gala, Daphne Kluger (Anne Hathaway), to wear the valuable ice so that they can rob her. They infiltrate the gala and create an elaborate scheme to separate Kluger and the diamonds from



the guards.

Once the diamonds come up missing, the gala is disrupted and a search begins. Split second timing and close calls accent the action but there's really no build up of suspense. Also, even though it's almost an allfemale cast, there's still boyfriend trouble. Uh huh, drama. So in addition to the con there's also some payback for the ex. Hence, a heist film that com-

bines fashion and humor, but just doesn't quite reach a George Clooney level of coolness. The inevitable twists at the end have a rather formulaic feel.

Directed and written by Gary Ross (*The Hunger Games*), *Ocean's 8* was no *Ocean's Eleven* but then neither was it the all-female *Ghostbusters*, thank goodness.


